Community-Centered Facility – Researching Viability

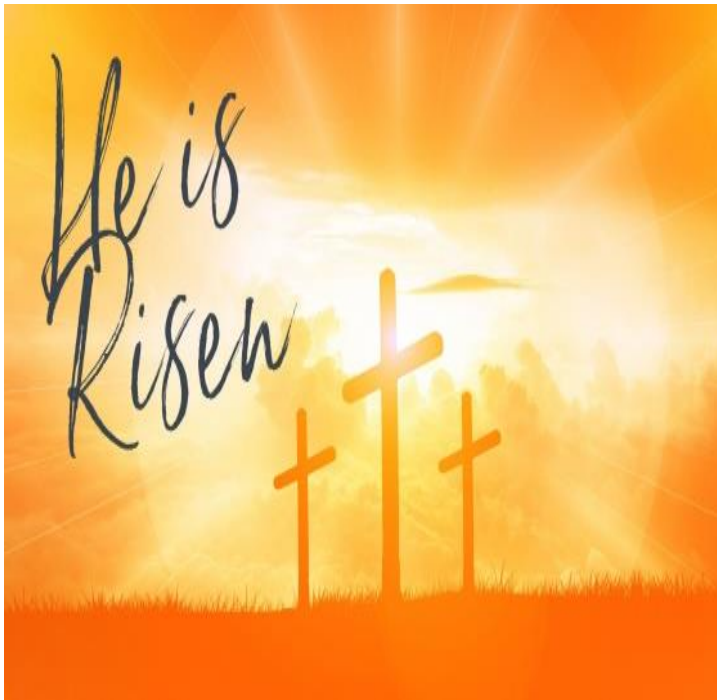
Included in this week's bulletin inserts is the March newsletter from Lindsay Area Development group (LAD) that highlights the current projects actively occurring and a look-back at the past 5 years. Of the top 5 strategic priorities the community had prioritized, 4 have been addressed.
